



- \$50 million






DES MOINES AIRPORT


PURPLE HEART HIGHWAY


Five-year total grants to MPO members (Federal Fiscal Years 2021-2025)

TOTAL AWARDS: \$72.2M

The Des Moines Area MPO has increasingly focused its funding on getting the most use out of existing infrastructure. Notably, the MPO is giving out more grants for major street reconstruction projects while investing in multimodal transportation options. This tightened focus on optimizing the existing transportation network is a major theme of the region's newly adopted long-range transportation plan, Mobilizing Tomorrow.







- Direct access to the majority of U.S., Canadian and Mexican rail network














Iowa's First Regional Water Trails Plan







Central lowa was state's only region without EDD designation from U.S. EDA.

It qualified for an EDD designation due to national emergency declaration for the pandemic – the first time the region has qualified since 2008 floods.

MAKING IOWA WHOLE

Mid-lowa has been missing out on funding.

EDDs are often the first to receive EDA funding after major disasters.

For example, Mid-lowa missed out on \$470,000 in no-match funding from the CARES Act because it lacked an EDD.

\$61.9 million in EDA investments in Iowa since 2018. Per-capita spending was six times higher outside Central Iowa.

\$3.2 million in Central lowa

(~ \$4/person)

\$58.7 million outside Central Iowa (~ \$25/person)
